INTRODUCTION ABOUT OF THE ORGANISATION

Lok Jagriti Sansthan Village Pahuti Post Saya Ambedkar Nagar was established on 14 January 1999, whose registered number is 1238. This organization is registered with FCRA. Whose registration number is 136780015. The organization was done with the objective of bringing awareness to the poor, poor, orphans, handicapped, dalits, underprivileged, minorities, women, children and old people and young women about their civil rights, rights and duties and to establish village self-government. Lok Jagriti Sansthan is working with 5110 poor families in 30 gram panchayats of Bhiti Katehri Tanda in three development blocks of Ambedkar Nagar district, MNREGA, PDS, social security scheme and right to education and flood affected families and their livelihood development. To provide support to the Divyangjan, Vikas Day Care Center is operating in Bhiti Development Block.

To strengthen communal harmony and national unity for the establishment of a society full of equality and justice.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND MANAGEMENT:

MANAGEMENT BODY:

An agency operated by a board consisting of 09 members. The officers are the chairman, vice-president, general secretary, secretary and treasurer and the remaining 04 are members of the

committee. The board meets regularly on a quarterly basis. Board members, apart from playing advisory roles in the organization, are also associated with thematic areas of the organization. All programs are audited by the quarterly Board of Assessors. The board passes necessary resolution before submitting programmes and projects for approval to the donor departments/agencies. In matters of recruitment and appointments, procurement of equipments and materials and monitoring financial and programme matters the board exercises necessary control, supervision and direction for achieving optimum results.

PROGRAMME MONITORING:

The organization conducts regular monthly meetings involving staff and volunteers. All programmatic decisions are taken in the meetings which are conducted in a participatory manner and decisions are arrived at after elaborate discussion. Reporting relationship is also maintained both upwards and downwards with regular flow of information. The board also reviews the work of the organization and gives necessary directions based on feedbacks from field offices.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT:

As far as financial management is concerned, the organization is guided by transparency in operations, and accounts are maintained in systematic manner at all levels. Monthly financial statement is prepared to monitor the financial status of each project. All the accounts (Cash book and ledgers) are maintained on daily basis. For different projects, separate books of accounts are maintained and the same are audited by an external auditor.

HUMAN RESOURCE:

Human resource is not a constraint for implementing any programme taken up by the organization. A dedicated team of personnel looks after the administration, control, accounts and other related activities of the organization. Besides this, the team of dedicated project staff including field workers, trainers, teachers and volunteers are also engaged. All are qualified and experienced to implement the projects run by the organization. Further the organization has a panel of experts whose services are engaged as and when required as per program needs. The organization follows sound HR principles for recruitment and appointment of staff. An ideal working environment is created so that the full potential of the human resource is delivered for implementation of programmes.

CURRENT ROLE AND PRIORITIES:

Lok Jagriti Sansthan plays the role of a socioeconomic development organization with the primary aim to reach out to the grass root level where deprived and disadvantaged people are identified and all possible helps are made available to make them stand on own legs and strive for better opportunities. It envisages enlarging its membership by enrolling likeminded persons with commitment towards selfless service to the society. At the grass root level it also takes in more and more dedicated volunteers with the objective to support those hapless persons and develop their leadership skills. In all the programmes the emphasis is to serve women, children and youths who have got a major role to play in the society. Playing an advocacy role the organization has been constantly presenting before the authorities at all levels the problems and grievances of

deprived people in programme areas and pleading for approval of humanitarian schemes and programmes which can become a turning point for betterment of their lives. It is to the credit of the organization that this role has been producing the desired results in as much as thousands of poor people at the grass root level have been uplifted and made to join the mainstream of society in various districts of the State.

PROGRAM ACTIVITY

AMRIT MAHOTSAV CELEBRATION

On August 14, a program of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav was organized and the disabled children came back to school from school via Pichwara, Sarai Jungle, Kachha Pichwara, Hridaypur. Gandhian message was given to everyone and tricolor flag was hoisted in 8 to 10 villages. Was distributed.

ESSENTIAL GOODS DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM TO DIFFERENTLY-ABLED CHILDREN BY GARIMA MAHILA MANDAL NTPC TANDA

Essential goods distribution program to differently-abled children by Garima Mahila Mandal NTPC Tanda 24 February 2022 Public Jagriti Sansthan Gram-Pahunti, Post-Saya, District-Ambedkar Nagar, Jagriti Vikas Kendra, Village-Pichwara, Post-Saya, District-Ambedkarnagar, studying in 10 to 18 years of mental retardation, cerebral palsy, autism and multiple Dettol, soap, handwash, for the prevention of corona epidemic by Mrs. Saroj Ahlawat and Garima Mahila Mandal secretary Mrs. Anita Parihar, President of NTPC Voluntary Organization Tanda, Mrs. Madhulika Singh, Vice President of Garima Mahila Mandal, Mrs. Saroj Ahlawat, 32 children affected by disability. Masks, gloves, and essential items like children's thermos bottle, water purifier machine, Chyawanprash, etc. were distributed.

NTPC voluntary organization Tanda Garima Mahila Mandal President got acquainted with the children before the distribution program! While getting acquainted with the children, Garima Mahila Mandal President, Mrs. Madhulika Singh wanted to know the identity of the differently-abled children, on which all the children told in their own words that you are affiliated to NTPC Tanda. Breakfast packets were also provided for the children by TPC Tanda management. The hearts of all the children swelled after receiving the goods, after which the General Secretary of Lok Jagriti Sansthan, Aarti Tripathi and the staff and children thanked NTPC Tanda! Delivery program successfully completed.

PENSION APPLICATION OF BENEFICIARIES

Vijay, Neeraj, Lavkush and Aadar of children studying at Jagriti Vikas Kendra, disabled Neetu Singh's documents were prepared and pension application was made and it was submitted to Vikas Bhawan District Handicapped Office and after 6 months of monitoring, information was received that their pension has been made.

CHILDREN'S LEGAL GUARDIAN PROGRESS

During the visit by the workers of Jagriti Vikas Kendra, a total of 50 disabled persons were identified to be shown the Legal Guardian Ship, out of which 16 disabled persons applied for getting legal certificate and the documents of 34 beneficiaries are incomplete, which will be applied after the documents are completed.

REGISTRATION OF CHILDREN UNDER NIRAMAYA BIMA POLICY

Out of 45 children associated with Jagriti Vikas Kendra, so far 36 children have been registered under Nirmaya Bima Yojana, apart from this 7 people from nearby villages of Jagriti Vikas Kendra have been registered under Nirmaya Bima Yojana and how to take full benefit of the scheme. It is told that if you get treatment for your children, then you will get 2.5 lakh rupees through this scheme but you will have to get treatment in a registered hospital and not from a satchel doctor, otherwise you will not get any benefit of insurance. If you get treatment from a registered hospital, then it is necessary to bring a drug treatment form, only then you can claim, so far, year wise total has been registered under Nirmaya Bima Insurance Scheme which is as follows

CLEAN INDIA MOVEMENT

21 November to 26 November 2022 Gram Swachhata Abhiyan Lok Jagruti Sansthan Gram Pahuti Post Saya Putting cleanliness into practice is the first step to cleanliness, this statement was made by organization head Aarti Tripathi, chief executive, going to every village with the help of disabled children studying in Serwa, Sugauti, Rudaupur. While addressing the cleanliness awareness program organized with the villagers including Badhiya, Mahapara, Kahi, Senpur, 2050 people present there were administered the oath to fulfill the cleanliness pledge and raised the slogan that our village will become the most beautiful village. Along with this, the message of cleanliness was encouraged by cleaning the streets of the village with the cooperation of the villagers.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

Under the Ainva Nyay Panchayat of Development Block Tanda, 26 youths and 31 girls of 7 gram panchayats are being trained by the organization in the employment of youth and girls of the area in sewing embroidery, cloth bag, pickles and making marmalade, along with the manufacture of masks was given training. Under the protection of Sunita and Bhanmati, 10,000 Cloth Bag were made and sold with the help of village panchayats. Where as 25 youth were given 10 days brick manufacturing training at Muskan brick kiln Ainwa. In which they got employment of about 4 months at the local level itself.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES 3 DECEMBER 2022



With the objective of providing recognition, respect and support to disabled children, on the occasion of World Disabled Day, Disabled Day was celebrated with enthusiasm at Jagruti Vikas Kendra, Village Pichwara in the presence of disabled children and parents. The program was organized by Ganga Prasad Yadav Advocate, Chairman of the program. The inauguration was done by garlanding the Saraswati statue and lighting the lamp by disabled children and organization head Aarti Tripathi.

Inaugurating the program, Rajesh Kumar Tripathi said that the development of disabled people was discussed by the All Nations Association in 1976 and 1981 was celebrated all over the world as the International Year of Disabled Persons, after this from 1983 to 1992, the development of disabled persons was celebrated all over the world. The United Nations Decade was implemented all over the world as a result of which various schemes were run by different countries for the welfare of disabled people. Along with this, it was agreed to celebrate 3rd December 1992 as World Disabled Day all over the world. Addressing the program, Pradeep Kumar Yadav gave information about the schemes run by the Government of India and the Government of Uttar Pradesh for the disabled. While giving information on the Niramay Health Insurance operated in collaboration with the National Trust, New Delhi, it was told that Niramay Health Insurance covers 4 people affected by disability. Category is health insurance for children affected by Mental Retardation, Multiple Disabilities, Cerebral Palsy, Autism, or alone, in which the payment for medicines up to Rs. 1 lakh in a year including external diseases, operation and physiotherapy is received under this scheme. This scheme provides for the health of the disabled. After this, Niramaya Health Insurance Card was distributed by the organization's head Aarti Tripathi to the parents of 21 children covered under health insurance and the children got first, second and third place in the biscuit competition and running competition. Prizes were distributed to the place

EDUCATIONAL TOUR 29 NOVEMBER 2022

An educational tour was given to 25 disabled children studying at Jagruti Vikas Kendra. First of all, they had the darshan of Shiv Baba and were shown swinging and after identifying different scenes in Rahmatullah Park, Akbarpur, they were shown swinging. After cultural dance in the park, children were served food. In Urmila Horticulture, children were made to identify flowers and fruit plants. As per the wish of the children, 10 flower plants and 5 fruit plants were taken for some schools and the children used them in the institute. Flowers and fruit trees were planted in empty places.

Necessary materials were distributed to disabled children by Garima Mahila Mandal NTPC Tanda Ambedkar Nagar.



Today, on 24th December 2022, on behalf of Garima Mahila Mandal NTPC Tanda Ambedkar Nagar, 33 disabled (mentally retarded, decency, cerebral palsy and disability) children registered at Jagruti Vikas Kendra of Lok Jagriti Sansthan were given shoes, track suit, Chyawanprash to protect them from cold.

School bags were given and the

disabled children were checked up by Dr. Hemant Kumar of Arogya Hospital NTPC and information was given about how the obstacles that hinder the development of children should be removed. Dr. Hemant while addressing the parents of the children present. Kumar told that this is an incurable disease, but just like you people tell children about the processes of living from childhood to adulthood, if you explain them in the same way, then there can be improvement to some extent. Don't believe that these children cannot improve. NTPC's Mrs. Mrinalini and Dr. Hemant Kumar and other guests were present in this program. The program ended with Aarti Tripathi, General Secretary of Lok Jagriti Sansthan, appreciating the gifts given to the children on behalf of NTPC and saying - done with thanks.

ORGANIZATION OF SEMINAR FOR THE HELP OF DISABLED PEOPLE

With the aim of spreading information about the schemes run by the Government of India and Uttar Pradesh for the help of disabled people to the general public, Lok Jagruti Sansthan organized a disabled awareness seminar under the chairmanship of Vinay Kumar Prajapati Manager at Ram Pyare Yashoda Devi Educational Institute, Sapna Tiwari Development Block, Katehari. Gaya Gosthi started with garlanding of Saraswati statue. Addressing the program, head of the organization Aarti Tripathi said that out of 28 categories of disabilities, 4 types of incurable ones are Mental Retardation Autism, by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Autonomous Organization of India, National Trust, New Delhi. Niramay Health Insurance Scheme for people affected by Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabilities is a very good scheme for the disabled. To join

this scheme, disability certificate, income certificate, Aadhar card, bank account and photo are required.



To join this health insurance scheme, you can contact the District Disabled Empowerment Office Ambedkar Nagar or Log Jagruti Sansthan Gram Pahuanti to join this scheme. Under this scheme, OPD and treatment of any other diseases can be availed by Yoga Doctor Hospital. The expenses incurred are paid into the account of the disabled person after claiming reimbursement by the National Trust, New Delhi within a month. Currently, there is no fee of any kind to join this scheme.

Or there is free insurance under which the cost of medicines worth one lakh rupees in a year is paid by the Government of India. There is also a scheme of Legal Guardian by the Government of India for the people suffering from incurable disability, only after joining this scheme, the benefit of the Disability Pension Scheme run by the government is given. And after the death of the parents, the disabled person can get a share in the movable property. The name of the disabled person comes in the property after the legal guardian. To sell the property of the disabled person, the recommendation of the District Officer is required under the legal guardian. Information on EDIT scheme for providing assistive devices to disabled people was given by Pradeep Kumar Yadav. Detailed information was provided by Nisar on programs related to marriage grant, disability certificate, bank account and skill development conducted for disabled people. Conclusion of the program: Presiding over the program, Vinay Kumar Prajapati was doing the program with the vote of thanks. 160 children along with the entire staff of the school were also present. Rajesh Tripathi Prabhakar Ramita Durga Prasad Yadav Geeta Anita had special support in the program.

26 JANUARY 2023 (74TH) REPUBLIC DAY



26th January (74th) was celebrated as Republic Day in the presence of 25 disabled children at Lok Jagruti Sansthan, Gram Pahanti Post, Saya District, Ambedkar Nagar, Jagruti Vikas (Central Day Care Centre), Village Pichwara Post, Saya, District Ambedkar Nagar, General Secretary of the organization, Aarti Tripathi. After that, the children were told that the Constitution came into force on 26 January 1950. On the occasion of Republic Day, many competitions including dance, singing, essay and speech were organized at Jagruti Vikas Kendra. The participating children were given copies and pencils.

AWARENESS PROGRAM ORGANIZED ON WORLD DOWN SYNDROME DAY

An awareness program was organized on World Down Syndrome Day in the presence of children and parents studying at Jagriti Vikas Kendra, Village Pichwara Post, Saya District, Ambedkar Nagar by Lok Jagriti Sansthan, Gram Pahanti. The program started with garlanding and lighting of lamp on Maa Saraswati. Addressing the program conducted by Pradeep Yadav Special Teacher, Program Secretary of the organization, Rajesh Tripathi said that Down Syndrome Day is being celebrated by the United Nations since March 21, 2012. This program is being organized on March 21, the third month of the year. The date of the day was chosen to reflect the feature of chromosome 21 (trisomy) which causes Down syndrome.

Various events were organized to raise awareness in the society towards people suffering from Down syndrome and sympathy. Let's go. Explaining the symptoms of Down syndrome, he said that it is also called trisomy 21. It is a genetic disorder that affects children. According to a report published in National Today, Down syndrome is a disorder that



occurs when 21 Chromosomes are duplicated. This development affects about 6000 children at the time of birth every year. Children affected by this disorder have specific facial features and their intellectual abilities are also weak. This problem can be solved through screening and some tests before the birth of children. And it can be identified after birth through genetic test. People suffering from Down syndrome have different facial features. This affects intellectual ability and physical development. Sometimes it can also be related to thyroid and heart disease. This makes it difficult to think, learn and understand. The child is late in speaking. It starts with hearing problems, immune deficiency, excess skin on the back of the neck, problems with the structure of the ears, mouth breathing, obesity, slimming anemia, thickening of the skin of palms and soles, thyroid, vision development problems. Addressing the program, special teacher Pradeep Yadav said that the structure of life of children affected by Down syndrome is different, the structure of the eyes also looks different from that of normal people, only half of the mouth and ears are smaller or larger, that of the neck is different. Also, hands and legs are small or the problem is often seen more in children who have premature pregnancies. If pregnancy occurs on time, then up to 80% of this problem can be avoided. Drawing competition cultural to bring awareness on Down syndrome in children. Program and Down syndrome movie was shown. Addressing the program, General Secretary of the organization, Aarti Tripathi said that if pregnancy is done on time, through timely investigation and tests, this problem can be avoided and change can be brought in life. Durga Yadav Ramita, Geeta, Tilakram Yadav, Anurodh Gupta, Ashok, Suresh, Prabhakar had special contribution in the program.

Family Welfare

The institution is providing information about the facilities being provided by the Health Department in the village by the government in which the referral services being provided for malnourished children with corona virus, vaccination of pregnant women and children, small family, woman on 2 children under happy family And also detailed information was provided by local and Neelam Pandey on male sterilization and benefits. This camp was organized at Ambedkar Community Development Center Katehari.

LITERACY AND EDUCATION PROGRAM

The education of rural children should not be affected during the holidays in schools at the time of corona virus lockdown. For this, with the help of 10 volunteers, children's education centers were operated at 12 places by the institution. Pens, pencils, copies and dry fruits were distributed to these children with local support so that the immunity of the children is good. A total of 166 children were connected to Child Education Centers from these centers operated by the institution.

HEALTH CAMPAIGN PROGRAM- MENTAL RETARDATION, CEREBRAL PALSY, AUTISM, MULTI DISABILITY

Health awareness camp for the health of people with autism, cerebral palsy and mental retardation was organized by the organization on 16 February 2022 at the block headquarters Bhati in which a total of 37 people participated. Giving information on the health of the mentally retarded in the program, Dr. Vinod Kumar said that due to the lack of oxygen for one hour at the time of the birth of the child, the child becomes a victim of lifelong mental retardation and the mental capacity is 6 to 10 years behind the similar children. 10 year old child has the same mental development as a 4 year old child. Autism is a congenital disability. But the mental development of these children is similar to that of children. But this child is very fond of solitude and these children have no relation with anyone. Due to which they are considered insane, if these children get special education, then the life of such a child can go ahead, so medicine should not be taken on the advice of any doctor, so that the full development of the children can be done. Cerebral palsy also comes under the category of a congenital disability. The mental abilities of these children are like normal children, these children tremble their hands and feet, if these children also get good education, they can be able to live life like children.

ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION PROGRAM

In order to contribute to the environmental protection and promotion of the general public by the institution, on World Environment Day, 5 June, 2022, an environmental awareness program was organized at Janta Janardan Inter College Raghupati Mijhoda Ambedkar Nagar from 1:20 pm on behalf of the school's manager Triyugi Narayan ji. was held under the chairmanship. In which, while addressing the children, Rajesh Kumar Tripathi, the program secretary of the organization, said that in today's time, we must plant at least 5 trees to prevent the increasing air pollution, noise pollution, soil pollution, water pollution, out of which one tree is fruitful. Trees and a tree should be planted of Peepal or Banyan, so that we can also contribute in reducing the threat of pollution. While addressing the children present in the program, the Principal of the school, Manokanika Dubey said that the tradition of environmental protection has been in our country since thousands of years ago, it is mentioned in Padma Purana that 150 is equal to sons and planting Peepal tree means 130 boys. The virtue obtained by giving birth is more complete than by planting a tree. Therefore, we all must do tree plantation, the program ends. Senior journalist of the school,

Navbharat Times, Ayodhya's Bureau Chief Triyugi Narayan Tiwari praised the environmental protection program being carried out by the organization and all the children were also called upon to plant two trees. Later, 10 Peepal, 5 Banyan, 2 Pakad, 2 Gular and 2 Jackfruit trees were planted in the forest located behind the school and 4 Ashok trees were planted in the school premises.

RURAL AGRICULTURE PROGRAM

The organization is doing experiments in agriculture for the economic up-gradation of 25 women farmers of 5 villages of its working area. With the technical support of Krishi Vigyan Kendra Pati Ambedkar Nagar, paddy was cultivated by 25 women farmers in a total of 1 hectare by Shree method. Women produced four times as much. Due to which an attempt was made to send a message in the area that if the laborer cultivates paddy in his little land by the method of Shree, then he can get the grain of the year in his own land, due to which this technology was discussed in the area.

HANDICRAFT TRAINING PROGRAM



Handicraft training program is being conducted by the organization in the house of Malti Devi under Shravan Kshetra Bazar, in which training of mats with locally available items, hand fan making, mani making, dolchi, singardani, was given to 117 teenage girls in three matches. Those who are doing this work well, due to which they are being able to meet their expenses.

HUMAN RIGHTS PROGRAM

World Human Rights Day was organized by the organization on 10 December 2022 in the presence of 650 children of Ashok Inter College Memorial Jivdharapur Ambedkar Nagar.

Expressing the resolve to further strengthen human rights, welfare and justice for the deprived sections, program coordinator Rajesh Kumar Tripathi said that the central government has given

high priority to the welfare and development of the weaker sections of the society.
